



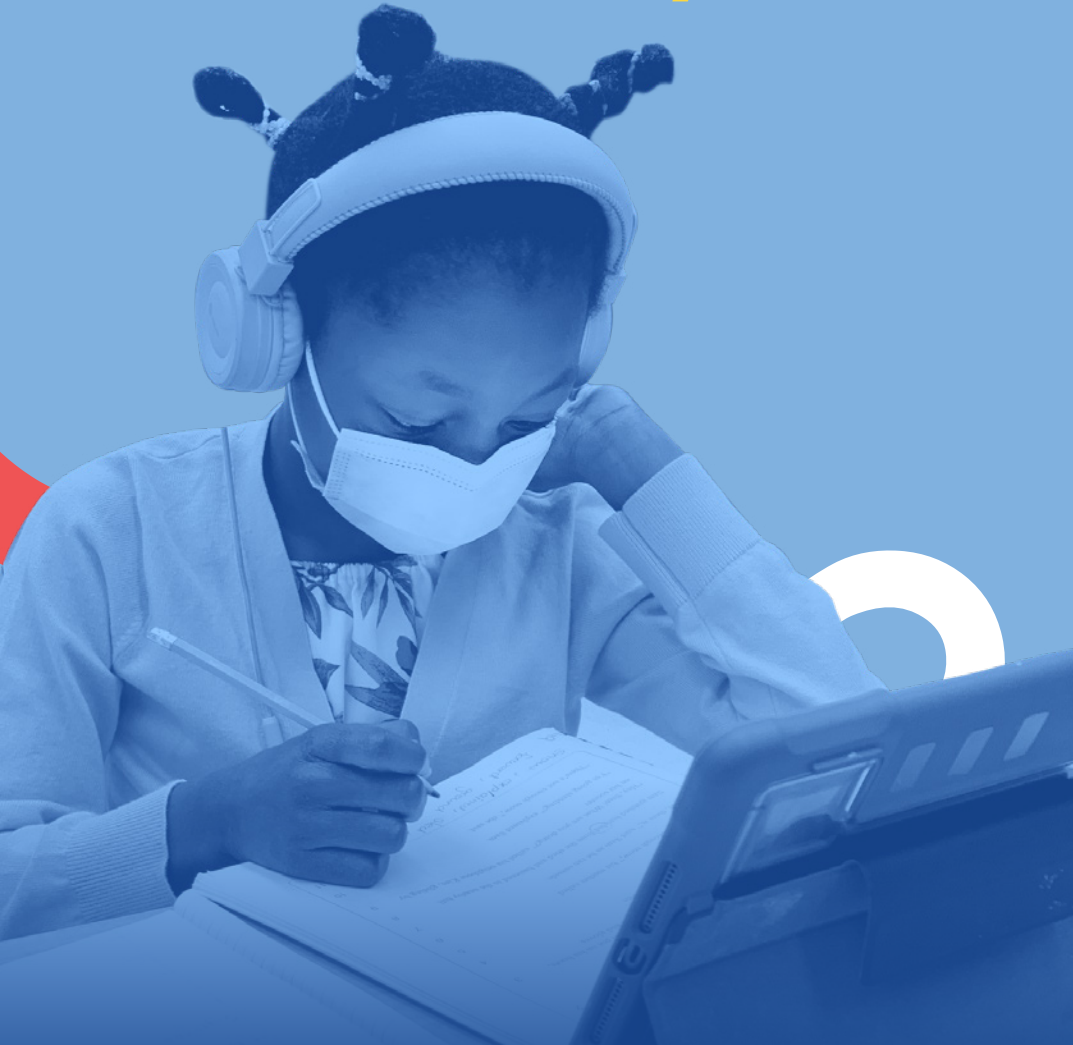

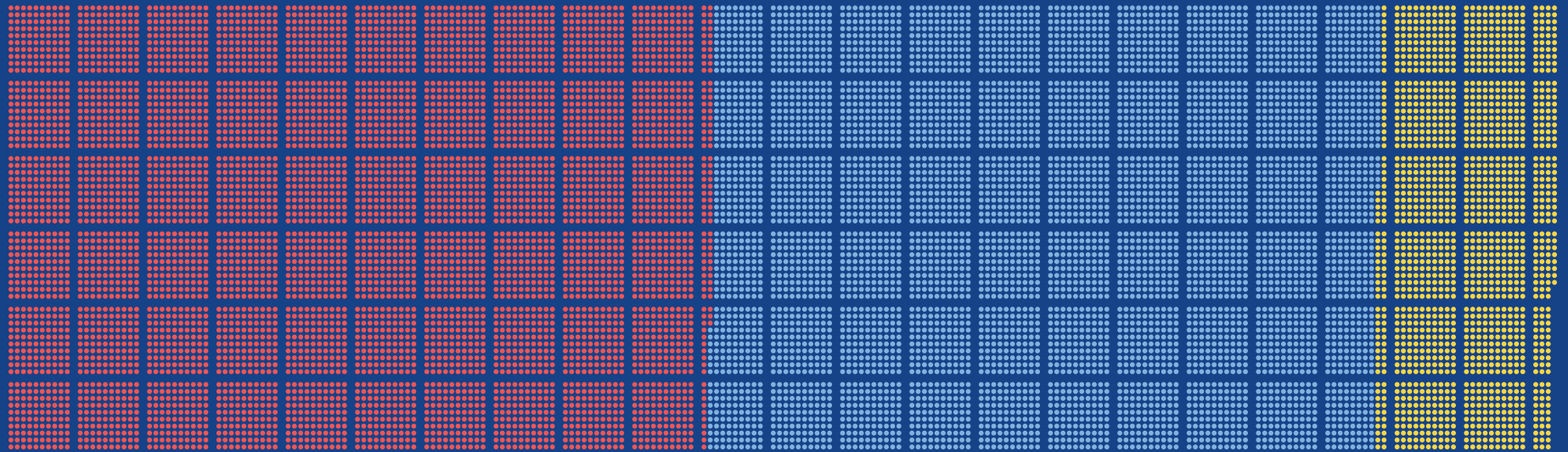
- Quality services to children 0 to 14 and their families

Who are the children and families we serve?

We've worked with low-income families and children in northwest Toronto since 1932. And as the city changed, so has our clientele. Today, 74% of our clients identify as Black, Indigenous, or as a Person of Colour (BIPOC); 28% have lived in Canada for less than five years. The top three postal codes we serve were identified by the City of Toronto as falling below the Neighbourhood Equity Score and thus requiring special attention.
